of Virginia Merchant. being sound of Mind & Body do make & Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in Manner and form following to wit In the first place I will
and desire that such debts and Duties as I shall owe at the time of my death
shall be well and Truly paid Also I give and bequeath to a certain young Woman
named Mary alias Grizel Gilchrist now living with my Sister Grace Goldie Wife
to Dr. Joseph Goldie in Liverpool - Two Hundred Pounds Sterling Also I leave
to my son Thomas Edgar Gilchrist One Thousand Pounds Virginia Currency over and
above my other part of my Estate he my be entitled to, to the end he may have a
Gentle and useful Education and the greatest part of this, I request may be un-
der the direction of my Couson German James Gibson Esq. of Kelton in Galloway in
Scotland and if he approves of it, at the School Dunfries in Scotland -----
All the rest & residue of my Estate whether real or personal subject to the
above charges & Legacies I give devise and bequeath to my beloved Wife Frances
Gilchrist my said Son Thomas Edgar my Daughters Elizabeth Gilchrist and
Frances Gilchrist to them and Their Heirs equally to be devided-----
LASTLY I constitute and appoint Deester Archibald Campbell of Norfolk Josiah
Cranbery of Suffolk and Thomas Gilchrist my Brother German and my beloved Wife
Frances Executors of this my last Will and Testament Revoking all former Wills or
dispositions IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto signed my Name and Affixed my
Seal the whole being wrote with my own hand this 24th September in the year of
our Lord 1771.
