In the name of God almighty the 24<sup>th</sup> instant of October anno 1654  
of our Lord god 1654 at John Dubbings Seminary in Boston, but  
in perfect memorye of my mate and my last will & testamēt left  
of the quæstion my sonnes to goe through my familiē & to determine by  
my body to y<sup>e</sup> ground from whence it was taken & for my worth  
doth as followeth: first my will & desire is y<sup>e</sup> all my estate be given  
first, & gived & bequeathed unto Edward Wootman Jr. a sum  
scirpt of two hundred £, y<sup>e</sup> same I give unto Stephen sonne mine  
Lydell Wootman to an honest pott wh<sup>e</sup> he hath in his possession, & then  
give unto John Davison one hundred £ in halfe callid in the  
name of mans chalfe & another callid & bodd & boylfyn & giv<sup>e</sup> down  
for this next yeare, y<sup>e</sup> same I give unto Robert Burroughs one hundred  
halfe of a hundred £ or rather by y<sup>e</sup> name of mans halfe, & so to  
give unto Edward Quates all my chalfe & all other goods wh<sup>e</sup> he  
& satisfieing for sume all charges, aitemise d<sup>e</sup> do make  
Exect<sup>e</sup> wh<sup>e</sup> is John Davison of this my will a copy.
