In the name of God Amen this twentieth of October Anno 7 years
of our god 1654 I John Dunning beinge sick in body, but
in perfect memory, doe make this my last will & testament first
I bequeath my soule to Jesus Christ my sanctifier & to James &
my body to y^e ground from whence it was taken & for my worldly
goods as followeth: first my will & desire is y^t all my debts be paid
first, I give & bequeath unto Thomas Workman James a bed
cuffer of two vertes of, I Item I give unto Stephen for one new
Cango cuffer & an iron pott w^{ch} he hath in his possession, I Item
give unto John Daxob one very large chaine of brass called by the
name of nans chaffe & another chaffe of bed & bolster & ground
for this next year, I Item I give unto Robert Busell one chaine
of brass called by y^e name of staves chaffe, I Item I
give unto Canon Crabbe all my chattels & all other goods w^{ch} I
be satisfieing for sumer all charges, & likewise I doe make my
entire whole & full devise of this my last will & testament
