sins, that I may be received into the heavenly Kingdom prepared for
eternal Happiness, my Body I commit to the ground to be decently
buried according to the Descretion of my Executor hereafter men-
tioned and as to the worldly Estate which it hath pleased Al-
mighty God to bequeath me with I give by his will as follows.

Mr. Igles and bequeath unto my Brother James by my stripes
my face to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his Body
Item I give and bequeath unto my Brother Benjamin by my half dole,
which I have laying on the North side of the Road going out of Norfolk
Town to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his Body for ever.
Item It is my Will that all my household Goods and Stock on my Plantas-
tions and every other Thing of my personal Estate whatsoever
Demanation forever be sold to discharge my just Debts, and then
the remainder I give and bequeath it to be equally divided between
my Brother Hillary my Sister Elizabeth and my Brother
William Share and Shares alike, I do hereby nominate and
appoint Josiah Smith of Norfolk Town Merchant my wholey
sole Executor of this my last Will, and I do revoke, disannul &
make void all former Wills by me made, as I further declare this
to be my last Will written on two sides of this one sheet of
Paper In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
