In the Name of God Amen I John Seneca of the Town of Portsmouth in
the Colony of Virginia being of sound mind ~~and~~ memory and understanding
but knowing the Certainty of Death and the uncertainty of Time and place
do make this my Last Will in Manner and following - That is to say
I Give devise and Bequeath unto my ever Loving wife Elizabeth Seneca all
my Estate whether Real or personal more Especially my Estate viz a House
and Lott in the Town of Portsmouth where I now live, I likewise give her
all my Wares Merchandizes Watch rings Jewells, and Debts owing due and
Payable unto me by any means Right or Title Whatsoever, And I do hereby
Nominate constitute and appoint the said Elizabeth Seneca the sole true

108. and only Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking
and making Void all other will or wills by me formerly made at any time
heretofore and do declare this to be my last will and Testament

of January in the Year of our Lord 1763. —
