In the Name of God Amen I John Jenkins of the Town of Portsmouth in
the Colony of Virginia being of sound mind — memory and understanding
but knowing the Certainty of Death and the uncertainty of Time and place
do make this my Last Will in manner and following That entitay —

I give devise and Bequeath unto my ever loving wife Elizabeth Jenkins all
my Estate whether Real or personal more especially my Estate of a House
and Lot in the Town of Portsmouth where I now live, I likewise give her
all my Mares Merchandise, Watch rings Jewels and Debts owing due and
payable unto me by any means Right or Title whatsoever, And I do hereby
nominate & constitute and appoint the said Elizabeth Jenkins the sole Exec

and only creature of his living last Will and Testament hereby Revoking
and making Void all other wills or wills before formerly made at any time
herebefore and do declare this to be my last will and testament.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12 day
of January in the Year of our Lord 1763.
