er, ^{living the other, I devise his moiety or half part to the survivor of them for every time he}
^{and that in case both my sons should die without issue}
er, but in case either of my said sons should die without issue, leaving my
Daughter Sarah Lee the whole of the said land with the appurtenances
unto my said Daughter Sarah Lee and the Heirs of her body Lawfully
begotten forever, I give and bequeath unto my said sons & Daughters after the
Death of my said wife and when they shall respectively arrive to the Age of

unto my said Daughter Sarah Lee and the Heirs of her body lawfully
begotten forever; I give and bequeath unto my said Sons & Daughters after the
Death of my said wife and when they shall respectively arrive to the Age of
Twenty one or day of marriage, all my Negroes, Stock, Furniture money, and
Debts, that I have here in left my said wife and the remainder of my money
and other personal Estate to be Equally divided between them and in case either
of them should die before the age of Twenty one or day of marriage, then
I give his or her part to the Survivor or Survivors and revoking all Wills
be one at any time here to fore made. I do appoint Col^d Mathew Godfrey
and my said wife Jane, Executors to this my last Will & Testament.
