My Will is that my Land and all my Estate be sold & the

out except my best Suit of Cloaths, which I give to my Brother Richard Ove-
ings and what Money shall be left after paying the above Legacies my Will
is that my Brother Joseph Oveings inherit, or if my said Brother Joseph
thinks proper to pay of the above Legacies without selling the Land it shall
be at his choice and I do appoint my Brother Joseph Oveings to be my whole
and sole Executor of this my last Will as Witness my hand & seal 28th June 1769
