lth but of sound mind and memory do make and constitute this my last will and
Testament as followeth. First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who
gave and my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors here-
after mentioned and my Temporal estate I dispose of as followeth.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Portlock only reserving the use to my wife during her
Natural life my land and plantation whereon I now live being by Estimation three hun-
dred and thirty Acres more or less with the appurtenances thereunto belonging after the decease
of my wife to him my son John and his heirs forever. I also give unto my son John Two Negro
boys namely America and Lipp also one bed and furniture and my Silver Hilted
Sword to him and his heirs.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Edward Portlock my land and plantation called
gilligans being by Estimation seventy Acres more or less to him and his heirs for Ever
I also give unto my son Edward sixty Acres of land I bought of Matthew Portlock
lying on the east side of Immer Portlock

of which I make and constitute this my last will and Testament as followeth. First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave and my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and my Temporal estate I dispose of as followeth.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Portlock, only reserving the use to my wife during her Natural life my land and plantation whereon I now live being by Estimation three hundred and thirty Acres more or less with the appurtenances thereunto belonging after the decease of my wife to him my son John and his heirs forever. I also give unto my son John Two Negro boys namely America and Sipp also one bed and furniture and my silver Hilted sword to him and his heirs.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Edward Portlock my land and plantation called Julligans being by Estimation seventy Acres more or less to him and his heirs for Ever I also give unto my son Edward sixty Acres of land I bought of Mathew Portlock lying on the east side of Samuel Portlocks land to him and his heirs forever I also give unto my son Edward my lott of land in the Town of Portsmouth joining on the land of Walter Gwyn to him and his heirs forever also Two Negro boys namely Cuffy and Affrica likewise one hundred pound in money to him my son

Edward and his heirs forever also one bed and furniture to him and his
but in case my son Edward should die before he arrives to the age of Twenty
that the several pieces of land that I have given to him shall descend
that is to say, the seventy acres call'd Gilligans to my son John Portlock and his
heirs and the sixty acres of land that I bought of Mathew Portlock to my son in law
Peter Edwards and his heirs and the lot of land in the Town of Portsmouth to my
Son in law Nathaniel Sater and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Edwards a Negro Girl named Amy
And a Negro man named Torcer that she is already posessed with to her and
her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Sater a Negro man named Jack that
I bought of Col. Boush and a Negro Girl named and her increase that she is already
posessed with to her and her heirs forever Also give unto my daughter Rebecca Sater
five pounds in Money to her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath unto my Niece Rezia Port Twenty pounds in money to her
And her heirs

Item And whatever money I have, not before given away, after paying my Just debts and funeral
charges There to be Equally divided between my Wife and I

Item And whatever money I have, not before given away, after paying my Just debt and funeral
Charges To be Equally divided between my Wife and Two Daughters Mary
Edwards and Rebecca Tatem and their heirs and all the rest of my Negroes not
before given away I leave to my wife during her Natural life, and at her decease I
give my Negro girl Phillis to my son John and my Negro Girl Violet to my son Edward
And their heirs and all the rest of my Negroes not before given away, at the decease of
my wife I leave to be Equally divided between my Two daughters Mary and Rebecca
to them and their heirs, and all the rest of my Estate not before given away of what kind soever both
Within and without doors I leave to my wife during her Natural life and at her decease
to be Equally divided between my four Children Namely John, Edward, Mary and Rebecca
and their heirs and lastly I do hereby Constitute and appoint my loving wife Abigail
Portlock and my son John Portlock Executors to this my last Will and Testament

Making void and disannulling all former Wills and bequeaths whatsoever and
ratifying and confirming this Only in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and first my Seal this Twenty sixth day of September one Thousand seven hundred and
