

In the name of God Amen I John Scott of the full County of
 of London do hereby make this my Last Will and Testament
 in manner and form following, viz

I Give and bequeath my Soul to God that Giver of all and my body
 to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors

and bequeath unto my Son or Sons I bequeath the sum of One
 Sterling for his Proportion of my Estate and likewise to his
 Daughters One Shilling Sterling for her Proportion of

the same and bequeath to my Son John Scott (when he returns)
 when she comes of Age One Negro Girl of one or two years old
 and if in case she should die without heirs then to my Son
 Willis Scott and his heirs

Then I Give bequeath unto my Son John Scott (when he returns)
 my Son and Daughters in Newport in the Isle of White and three
 Negroes, viz Prince Lucretia and Susanna to him and his
 heirs, to if in case he dies without lawful heirs then to my
 Son Will & Scott and his heirs forever

41. I Give and bequeath unto my Son William Scott and his heirs
one Land in and about Norfolk and four Acres, viz^t
Jack's isle, Phillis and Mumble —

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son William Scott when I shall be
Appointed, Whole and Sole Executor of this my Last Will all
I owned my House hold goods and all my other Movable to
reimburse all my Debts and likewise to pay all my Debts In
Witness whereof I have to put my hand and Seal this 16th
day of June 1751
