blessed be God of good & perfect memory doe Ordaine & make this my
last will & testament v^t First I bequeath my soule unto Almighty God
trustinge through the Meritts of my Saviour Irist Iesus to Enter
into his everlasting Kingdome. Also I bequeath my body to y^e Earth
from whence it came, & therein to be buried by my hereafter name &
sufficient. And as for my worldly Estate w^{ch} y^e Lord it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me I bequeath & followeth. I give & bequeath
that p^{te} or p^{rt} of lands Commonly called Swanen
Point now in y^e possession of Heale Woody to be sold for & to pay
y^e paymt^t of my debts suddenly after my decease by my hereafter execut^r
assent. Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife All my
Estate & all my forwarde & also my boate Item I give & bequeath
unto Mary Gibson my daughter all y^e residue of my land & house been
adjoininge unto Swanen Point afore said & to her heires forever Item
I give & bequeath unto Henry Wyke All my right & title of that
land now in y^e possession of Richard Wyke, after y^e Expiration of the
now made lease and to his heires forever. All y^e residue of my lands
I give & bequeath unto my son John Gibson.

I have now in my possession of Hecto M. today to be sent for & for
y^e payment of my debts suddenly after my decease by my hereafter made
testament. Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife all my
estate & all my possessions & also my house. Item I give & bequeath
unto Mary Gibson my daughter all y^e residue of my land & house being
adjoining unto Swanen Point afore said & to her heirs forever.
I give & bequeath unto Henry Wade all my right & title of that
land now in y^e possession of Richard Dinnen, after y^e expiration of the
now made lease and to his heirs forever. All y^e residue of my land
I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife afore said & to her heirs forever.
Item I give & bequeath unto Margaret Weststead with full hundred
pounds of tobacco to be delivered her in goods. Item I give & bequeath
unto Elizabeth daughter of y^e sd Margaret Weststead one Cow called
Goulden rook & one very huge shee value to be delivered y^e next
Spring after my decease. All y^e residue of my goods & chattels
whatsoever (after my debts satisfied) to be equally divided into three
parts. Two parts whereof I give unto my afore said beloved wife & the
third part to my afore said daughter & her heirs. And if it shall
happen my said daughter to deale this life before my youngest her
husband to Gent y^e said. Then my will is y^e y^e one half of y^e estate

afors^e, by me given unto her, returned backe to my said wife, And tholken halfe
to m^e. Richard Donquest my 1st daughter's husband And further my will
meaninge is, that the Estate by me given to my 1st daughter, be & remaine
wholly & solely to her own proper use. And if in case her 1st husband or any
other for his use, shall Endeavour to defraud or take any p^{te} or p^{or}tion thereof
from my 1st daughter. Then my will is y^t my beloved wife shall have and
Enjoy all & every p^{te} thereof, to her own proper use. Trustinge in thought
God y^t my 1st wife will be a mother to her, for & towards her welfare, if
made require ~~there~~ of give & bequeath unto my beloved brother in law
Thomas Lambert son of R^{ich}ard & my daughter, ~~there~~ of give unto
William Jorvis my blake hilted rapier & belt, & all such debts as are

I make my 1st beloved wife my sole executrix of this my last will

Order to be recorded the 16th Day of August

Whereas by Order of Courts bearing date the first day of June 16th
all differences touching between Thomas Hall and the Heirs of the
children of Richard Inverford late in the tuition of Francis Land and the
Francis Land on the behalf of himself were referred to us to hear and
determine, we do hereby order and appoint that Robert Spence Attorney of
the said Francis Land shall pay or cause to be paid unto Thomas Hall and
the Heirs of the said Children at or before the last of November next ensuing
the value hereof the sum of canon hundred pounds of good tobacco and
cattle for and in consideration of a store which did belong to the said Children
and sold by the said Francis Land And we do further order that the said
Robert Spence shall pay or cause to be delivered unto the said Thomas Land
for the sale of the said Anne Inverford one moola and seven stone full of
brothel before the value and quality of her the said Anne together with a change
of headmen hundred and fifty moola and cotton with a pair of shoes
and that the said moola be within twenty days after the date hereof both which
payments are to be made out of the Estate of the said Francis Land at about
us expressed and Executed
