ing that all Man on Earth must die I do make this my last Will and
Testament I bequeath my Body to the Earth to be buried according to the
Direction of my L^{ds} and my soul into the hands of God who gave it to
me and my worldly Goods as follows
I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife the use of all my land and
Plantations during her Life

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Hanbury my Plantation down
below that I formerly lived on and four hundred Acres of Land belonging
to it unto him and his heirs or assigns for ever, my Desire is that all my
Tools of all sorts that I have may be equally divided between my two sons
William and Job also I give unto my son William one young horse and a
small gun and sword

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Job Hanbury my Plantation whereon
I now dwell and all the Land belonging unto it and a piece of Juniper
Swamp Land that I have joining to Cap: Wilborne unto him & his heirs
and assigns for ever also my hand Mill stones and one gun

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Novay one feather Bed &
Furniture belong to it and a small ^{iron} pot unto her and her heirs & assigns for
ever

Item I give all the remaining part of my Estate that I have not above mentioned
unto my loving Wife during her life and after her decease I leave my
Estate to be equally divided among all my Children only forty shillings
I give to my Daughter more than either of my two sons to be took out of
my Estate that is to be divided among them

Item I leave my loving Wife and my son William my two Executors &
