to God for the same and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body know-
ing that all Men on Earth must die I do make this my last Will and
Testament to bequeath my Body to the Earth to buried according to the
Direction of my ^{W^{ife}} and my soul into the hands of God who gave it to
me and my worldly goods are follows

I give and bequeath unto my loving Neff^h hood of England and
Plantations during her life

And I give and bequeath unto my son William Hanbury my Plantation down
below the River of Tidore and four hundred acres of Land belonging
to it unto him and his heirs or a piece for ever, my Desire is that all my
Tools of all sorts that I have may be equally divided between my two sons.
William and Job also I give unto my son William one young horse and a
small gun and sword.

And I give and bequeath unto my son Job Hanbury my Plantation whereon
I now dwell and all the Land belonging unto it and a piece of Juniper
Swamp land that I have joining to Cap. Wilsons unto him & his heirs
and a piece for ever also my hand Mill stones and one Gun.

And I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Nosay one feather Bed &
Furniture belonging to it and a small pock unto her and her heirs before mentioned for
ever.

And I give all the remaining part of my Estate that I have not above mentioned
unto my loving Wife during her life and after her decease I leave my
Estate to be equally divided among all my Children only forty shillings
I give to my Daughter more than either of my two Sons to be took out of
my Estate that is to be divided among them.

And I leave my loving Wife and my Son William my two Speculators
in the Plantation.

Every —

I give all the remaining part of my Estate that I have not above mentioned
unto my loving Wife during her life and after her decease I leave my
Estate to be equally divided among all my Children only forty shillings
I give to my Daughter more than either of my two Sons to be took out of
my Estate that is to be divided among them.)
And I leave my loving Wife and my son William my two Executors
