

In the Name of God, amen. I John Ferabee of Norfolk County
and Parish of Portsmouth being sick and weak in Body but of perfect
mind and Memory. Do make Ordain, Constitute and Appoint this
to be my Last Will and Testament in manner and Form as followeth
viz. Item I Give and Bequeath to my son Charles Ferabee the
Land that came by his Mother adjoining Edward Speckman's Land
Sixty Acres be it more or less to him and his Heirs forever also fifty
Acres of Land be it more or less that I bought of James Sikes adjoining
thereto both which abovesaid Lands I give unto my son Charles Ferabee
and his Heirs forever; also I give unto my said son Charles Ferabee half
a Lot of Land lying and being near the Great Bridge adjoining James
Jollifs half Lot. To him and his Heirs forever. also I give unto my said
son Charles Ferabee Twenty Nine Acres of Cypress Swamp more or
less adjoining Richard Jollifs Land and John Corynns Land to him
and his Heirs forever. Also I give my said son Charles Ferabee all my

Creek and Thomas Burgess's Land To my said Son and his Heirs for
ever, also my Longest small Bored Gun & the half of my Coopers -
Tools to him and his Heirs forever.

Item. I Give and Bequeath to my son John Ferbee the Land and Plantation
whereon I now live containing Ninety Acres be it more or less;
also Ten Acres adjoining the said Land and Timothy Jones more or
less which said said Lands I give unto my son John Ferbee and his Heirs
forever, but if my son John Ferbee should die without Lawfull Heir of
his Body then my will and Desire is that the above Lands Given to my
Son John Ferbee should fall to my son Willis Ferbee and his Heirs forever
Also I give my son John Ferbee half my Survey in the Juniper Swamp on
that side that adjoins John Williams to him and his Heirs forever; also
I give my son John my Bequest Gun and the other half of my Coopers -
Tools to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my son Willis Ferbee the Land and Plantation
that my Father gave to his son Thomas Ferbee being seventy five acres
more or less which said I give unto my Son Willis and his Heirs

that my father gave to his son Thomas Ferebee being seventy five acres
more or less which said I give unto my son Willis and the Heirs of his
Body forever. But if my son Willis should Die without Lawfull Heirs
my Will and Desire is the Land I gave my son Willis shall fall to my
son John Ferebee and his Lawfull Heir forever also I give my son Willis
all my Right and Title of Land on the West side of Robert Tuckers Mill
Run to him and the Heirs of his Body forever. But if my son Willis
should Die without Lawfull Heirs of his Body then my Will and Desire
is on the West side of Robert Tuckers Mill Run shall fall to my son
John Ferebee and his Lawfull Heir forever. Also I give and Bequeath unto
my son Willis Ferebee the other half of my Survey of the Juniper Swamp
to him and his Heirs forever I also give unto my loving wife Mary
Ferebee the Use and Profits of my Negro Fellow Robin during her Widowhood
and at her Death or Marriage I give will and Bequeath the said Negro
Robin unto my son Willis Ferebee and his Heirs forever my Will is that
if my wife should Die before my son Willis come or arrives to be Twenty
Years Old that the Profits from the said Negro Robin shall fall equally
Between my two sons Charles Ferebee and John Ferebee, untill my son
Willis arrives to Twenty years of Age

all my Right and Title of Land on the West side of Robert Tuckers Mill
Run to him and the Heirs of his Body for ever. But if my son Willis
should Die without Lawfull Heir of his Body then my Will and Desire
^{the Land} is on the West side of Robert Tuckers Mill Run shall fall to my son
John Terebee and his Lawfull Heir for ever. Also I give and Bequeath unto
my son Willis Terebee the other half of my Survey of the Juniper Swamp
to him and his Heirs for ever. I also give unto my Loving wife Mary
Terebee the Use and Profits of my Negro Fellow Robin during her Widowhood
and at her Death or Marriage I give will and Bequeath the said Negro
Robin unto my son Willis Terebee and his Heirs forever. my Will is that
if my wife should Die before my son Willis come or arrives to be Twenty
Years old that the Profits from the said Negro Robin shall fall equally
Between my two Sons Charles Terebee and John Terebee, untill my son
Willis arrives to Twenty years of Age. — My Will is the half Survey
adjoining William Tuckers should be sold by my Executors either at Public or
private Sale which shall be most proper. To pay Debts and Defray Charges
and if the half Survey of Juniper Swamp be not sufficient to Discharge
