1766 I John Wallis of the County of Norfolk being Sick in Body, but
of good and perfect Memory, thanks be to Almighty God and calling
to Remembrance the uncertain Estate of this Transitory Life, and that
all Flesh must Yield unto Death. When it shall Please God to
call, I do make, constitute, Ordain and declare this my last Will,
and Testament in In manner and Form following, Revoking and
annulling by these presents all. —

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Simons and my Daughter
Mary Wallis One Negroe Woman called Jane she and all her Increase
to be Equally divided between my Two Daughters Martha and Mary
to they and their Heirs, she and all her Increase that she has from
the Date of One thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty five to the Date
of One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty then to be Equally divided
to them and to my Daughter Martha I Give One Feather Bed & Fornet

25 I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Simons and my daughter
Mary Wallis One Negro Woman called Jane she and all her Increase
to be Equally divided between my Two Daughters Martha and Mary
to they and their Heirs, she and all her Increase that she has from
the Date of One thousand seven Hundred and Sixty five to the Date
of One thousand seven hundred and Eighty then to be Equally divided
to them and to my Daughter Martha I Give One Feather Bed & Trunk
and One bow and half, and to my Daughter Mary I Give one Feather
Bed and Trunk and One bow and half, and one Trunk One white Mare
It I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Warden One Negro Girl
during her Natural Life that she has now living with her called Nance
and at her Decease this Negro Girl Nance and all her Increase to
be Equally Divided between her three Sons John, William and Wallis
to them and their Heirs and to my Daughter Elizabeth I Give one
Feather Bed that she has already received and I Give her also

One Cow and half

I Give and Bequeath to my son Samuel Wallis One Negro Boy
Jame to him and his Heirs. and One Feather Bed and ~~Formet~~
and all my Working Tools and a Hand Mill and a Mare and one
Heiffer and my Two Guns.

I Give and Bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth Wallis all my
whole Estate, within and without during her Natural Life or
Widowhood leaving her full and whole Executor to Act and do
as my self to pay all Lawfull Debts but if she should Marry
then the above mentioned Legacies to be delivered and all the Rest
of my Moveable Estate to be Equally divided to my Wife & Children
Martha, Mary, Elizabeth, Samuel and if she never Marry's to be
Equally divided at her Decease.
