

In the Name of God, Amen, I John Wilkins of Norfolk County
being weak of Body but of sound and perfecter memory thanks be to God
for it and calling to mind the uncertainty of Mans life and knowing
that all Flesh must yield to the Stroke of Death, Doth think fit to
appoint order and Ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament this
5th day of February 1768. and no other. Revoking and disanulling all
other Will or Wills and taking this only for my last Will and no other and
first my Will and desire is that all my just and Lawful Debts be
truly paid and then I Give and bequeath as followeth, viz. —

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son John Wilkins One Negro Man called
Nenport, and the half of my Land in Blackwater Swamp joining
to John Holsteads Land to him and his Heirs lawfully begotten of his
Body forever. I also give to my son John Wilkins One Gun and a pair of
Stillyards. —

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Malachi Wilkins One feather Bed and
Furniture belonging thereto and one round Table and a Case of Bottles

Furniture belonging thereto and one round Table and a Case of Bottles
and a pair of Money Scales and half a dozen of pewter Plates to him &
his Heirs forever, and one Sorrell Mare.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Robert Wilkins the Land and Plantation
where Snowdwell and the first Child that my Negro wench Sufuinah
brings that lives to be a year Old, and all the Remainder of my Land
in black water Swamp, and one Feather Bed and furniture, and one
Gun, and Chest and Desk, and a pair of Stilleyards and one Iron Cott &
half a dozen of high Chairs and a Table and a hand Mill, and the half of
my ley der Cask to him and his Heirs lawfully, begotten of his Body
for ever and one Mare called Jenny.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Key-ah Wilkins, One Feather Bed &
Furniture and two pewter Dishes and two Pewter Basons and half a dozen
of Plates to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Lydia ^{Britt} One Negro Wench called

where I now dwell and the first Child that my Negro wench Sufuinah
brings that lives to be a year Old, and all the Remainder of my Land
in black water Swamp, and one Feather Bed and furniture, and one
Gun, and Chest and Desk, and a pair of Stilliards and one Iron Cott &
half a dozen of high Chairs and a Table and a hand Mill, and the half of
my ley der back to him and his his Heirs lawfully, begotten of his Body
for ever and one Mare called Jenny.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Keyah Withins, One feather Bed &
Furniture, and two pewter Dishes and two Bristle Bafors and half a dozen
of Plates to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Lydia ^{Britt} One Negro Wench called
Hannah, and a Horse called Smoother to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Withins One Negro Wench
called Sufuinah and one Feather Bed and furniture and one Chest &
two Ewes and Lambs and half a dozen of Stone Plates to her and her

Heirs forever.

Item I Give to my Daughter Sally Wilkins One Negro Girl called Sarah and one Feather Bed and Furniture and one side Saddle and a Tea Kettle and all my Tea Ware and two Cows and Lambs to and her Heirs lawfully begotten of her Body forever.

I also Leave all the Remainder part of my Estate on given to be divided between my three Sons John Malachi and Robert.

I also appoint my Son John Wilkins and my Son Malachi Wilkins my Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
