In the Name of God amen February
the first, in the year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven
hundred and Seventy one I Joel Jackson in the County
of Norfolk in the Colony of Virginia being sick and weak
of Body but of perfect mind and Memory, thanks be to
God for the same, and calling to mind the Mortality of
my Life and knowing that it is appointed for once to
Die I do make and ordain this to be my last Will

and Testament, Viz, first of all I give and recommend my
Soul into the Hands of God who first gave it me, and for my
Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian
like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as touching such
worldly Estate wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in
this Life I give and dispose in the following manner and
form

Item I give to my Wife Frances Jackson the use of my house
and Plantations during her Widowhood making no waste nor
selling any Timber of the S^d Land.

Item I give to my loving Son Joel Jackson, my House and Plan-
tations, after the Death or Widowhood of my Wife Frances
Jackson I give it to him and his Heirs forever, likewise a
Negro Boy Named George to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give to my loving Daughter Ann Jackson a Negro Boy
named Charles, to her & her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my loving Daughter Peggy Jackson a Negro Boy
named Jupiter to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my loving Wife Frances I shoud have more

named Jupiter to her and her Heirs forever.
 Item I give to my loving Wife Frances & should have given my
 Negro Woman named Nancy during her Widowhood, and
 she with her Increase to be ^{equally} divided between my
 Son and Two Daughters to them and their Heirs forever.
 Item I leave all

Item I leave all my Personal Estate within Doors and without
to be equally divid between my Wife Frances Jackson
and my Son and Two Daughters to them and their Heirs
forever. I likewise constitute make and ordain my
loving Wife Frances Jackson my sole Executrix of this
my last Will and Testament disanulling and Disallow-
ing all other Wills made before this whatsoever at any
Time whatsoever In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal the Date first above written.
