

In the Name of God Amen I Joel Moshum of Norfolk Borough being weak and low, but of sound mind, and memory do make this my last will and Testament viz, I expressly desire that the ~~new~~ House now build-
-ing on the Land I bought of William Porter may be completely finished as soon as possible, and the expence to
be paid out of my estate, which House with the Lands I give to my wife Elizabeth during her life, and after
her decease to my daughter Margaret Moshum and her Heirs forever. But in case my said daughter Margaret
should marry before my wife's death I desire that she may have one half of the Lands to build a house thereon -
if she inclines. —

Item I give to my wife Elizabeth the following slaves Tom, Jem, Prince, Sarah and Patina during her life, and after
her death I give the said negroes to my daughter Margaret and her Heirs forever. But in case my wife should
marry I then desire that the negroes Jem, Prince, and Patina, be given up to my daughter Margaret. —

Item I give my negroes Jimmy and Bob to ~~my daughter Margaret Moshum and her Heirs forever.~~

Item I give to my daughter supposed daughter Rebecca Moshum child of Elizabeth Wilson my negroes Sylvia &
Lury ^{to her} and her Heirs forever. —

Item I give the Lot of Lands in the field which I bought from Charles Cooper to be equally divided between my daughter
Margaret Moshum, and my supposed daughter Rebecca Moshum child of Elizabeth Wilson, but desire that part
on which the Brick work stands, be given to Rebecca. —

Item I give to my supposed daughter Rebecca Moshum child of Elizabeth Wilson the Lot of Lands formerly the —

property of Talbot Thompson which was escheated and sold agreeable to an act of Assembly and desire that my executors may have the title made good.

Item I give to my daughter Margaret Moshum and my supposed daughter Rebecca Moshum child of Elizabeth Wilson each a Bed and furniture, and desire that my wife Elizabeth may have all the rest of my household and kitchen furniture, plate and other moveables during her life and after her death I give the whole to my daughter Margaret Moshum and her heirs forever.

Item I desire that my ^{said} supposed daughter Rebecca Moshum child of Elizabeth Wilson may live with my wife, be supported and maintained as my daughter, and if she behaves well and dutifully that the sum of fifty pounds specie be paid to her out of my estate when she marries. In case the said Rebecca child of Elizabeth Wilson should die before she marries then I desire that the lands and slaves bequeathed to her should revert to my daughter Margaret Moshum.

Item I desire that my mother may be maintained and supported out of my estate during her life if she lives with my wife. But if she inclines to separate from her and lives else where I desire that the sum of twenty pounds specie be paid to her annually out of my estate during her life.

Item I desire that all my Smiths tools iron and other utensils about the shop with my flat and Boat be sold by my executors.

Item I desire after ^{all} my just debts and funeral expences are paid that all the rest of my personal estate be placed in the hands of my wife Elizabeth for the support of the family during her life and after her death the whole to be given to my daughter Margaret Moshum and her heirs forever. But if my wife should marry I then desire that the whole may be equally divided between my wife and daughter Margaret Moshum.

Lastly I desire that there may be no appraisement of my estate, and hereby nominate and appoint my
