Jonathan Poyner of the County of Norfolk and Parish of St. Bride, being in
a good state of Health and of disposing mind and Memory do make
Constitute, Ordain and Appoint this to be and contain my last Will
and Testament in manner and form following viz^t —

Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my son Jonathan Poyner my
Plantation and Land Situate on Currituck Shore in the County of
Currituck containing One hundred Acres to him and his Heirs
for ever. —

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Suannah Chrisman
a Feather Bed, bow and calf, a Wooling Wheel, two pewter Basons
and an Iron Pot which she hath already in her Possession as her
full Portion or part of my Estate. —

Witness my hand and seal the day and year first above written
Jonathan Poyner the Manor Plan-

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Suannah Chrissman
a Feather Bed, bow and calf, a Wooling Wheel, two pewter Basons
and an Iron Pot which she hath already in her Possession as her
full Portion or part of my Estate. —

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son James Poyner the Manor Plan-
tation and Land whereon I live, also Fifty Acres of Land adjoining
it which I bought of Nehemiah Jones, likewise the Plantation and
Land I bought of John Coats, containing Fifty Acres, to him and his
Heirs for ever, I Likewise give to my Son James Poyner my Still,
Still Cap and Worm, also all the cattle, Hogs and Sheep which is
in his mark viz, (under square the Right Ear, crop under that and
over heel the left Ear) also one young Mare called Diamond, and one
Feather Bed & Furniture to him and his Heirs for ever. —

and desire is that if my son James Poyner dies before he
comes to the Age of Twenty One years and leaves no Issue of his Body
lawfully begotten, that then the Lands I gave to him, shall go and
devolve to my son Jonathan Poyner.

Item, I Give and bequeath to my loving Wife Dorcas Poyner all my
Estate within Doors and with ^{out} Doors (not before given) during her
Natural Life and after her Decease to my son James Poyner and
his Heirs for ever and I nominate and Appoint my Wife Dorcas
Poyner my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament.
Signed, Sealed, Pronounced and Declared in presence of us.
