Perfect mind and Memory, make this my last Will and Testament &
is as follows Viz. —

Item I give to my Brother Richard Simpson of London the
Sum of One Shilling Sterling to be paid him at my decease.
Item I give to John Tickell of the Borough of Norfolk aforesaid my present
best Suit of Cloaths after my decease —

Item I give to my Brother William Simpson of the Borough & Colony
aforesaid: all the remainder of my Estate Lands and Personal Ef-
fects, which doth or may hereafter belong or become due to me, with
in the Colony of Virginia aforesaid, or any other place, or Dominion
whatsoever, (or how) I also constitute and appoint (my whole & Sole)
Executor of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby revoke
disallow and disannul all former Bequests Wills & Legacies
by me left or made ratifying and confirming this and no other

unto set my hand and Seal this Twentieth day of September 1768.
