remaining part that is left both within Doors and without I lend
unto my well beloved Wife Margaret Suggs during widowhood or life
and my Will and desire is that after her Decease the remainder
part be equally divided between my other three Sons Stephen Suggs,
and Aquila Suggs and William Suggs. and my Will and Desire
that my Youngest Son William Suggs may live with my well beloved
Wife and that he see that he has his Learning.

Item Now as a free Gift or Legacy unto my Well beloved Wife Margaret
Suggs One Feather Bed and Furniture and One large Chest six Pewter
Plates One Basin and a Frying pan one Iron pot. Likewise I ordain
and appoint my loving wife Margaret Suggs my whole & Sole Executrix
of this my last Will and Testament as Witnesses whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand fixed my Seal this twelfth day October one thousand
seven hundred and Sixty Three.
