

114 In the Name of God Amen. I Samuel Willoughby of
Norfolk Borough, being of perfect mind and memory and calling to
mind the uncertainty of the Time of Death hereby revoking all other
Wills by me made. Do this Twenty fourth Day of October One thousand
seven hundred and Sixty Three, make this my last Will and Testament
in Manner following.

Imprimis I Recommend my Soul to Almighty God, hoping for a Blessed
Resurrection and Life eternal thro the Merits of Jesus Christ.
Item I Give and Bequeath to my Eldest Son Samuel Willoughby the
House that I now live in with all the Land as it now stands Inclosed
with the Improvements thereon being about the one half of my
Lot of Land in Norfolk Borough. The same I Give to him and
his Heirs for ever.

Item I Give to my son James Willoughby my Brick House joining the
Main Street, with the other Part of my Lot of Land as it is now
Inclosed, and in the Occupation of John Cook I Give the same to

Inclosed, and in the Occupation of John Cook I give the same to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my well Beloved wife Martha Willoughby, During her Life the Labour and Service of such a Quantity of Slaves not exceeding ten in Number for and towards the Support of Raising my Children and herself, which Ten Negroes she may make Choice of. I Likewise give and Bequeath to my wife Martha Willoughby, the whole of my Household Furniture, to her and her heirs, and it is my Will and Desire that my Estate should not be Appraised And I do farther give my wife the Use and Profits of the Houses and Land that I have given my son Samuel Willoughby During her Life.

Item And it is my desire, as my wife is now with Child, in Case if please God she should be delivered with a Son, it is my Will and Desire, and I do give and Bequeath to said Son the Houses

Willoughby. During her Life the Labour and Service of such
a Quantity of Slaves not exceeding ten in Number for and
towards the Support of Raising my Children and herself, which
Ten Negroes she may make choice of. I Likewise Give and
Bequeath to my wife Martha Willoughby, the whole of my House-
hold Furniture, to her and her heirs, and it is my Will and
Desire that my Estate should not be Appraised And I do farther
Give my wife the Use and Profits of the Houses and Land that I
have given my son Samuel Willoughby During her Life. —
Item And it is my desire, as my wife is now with Child, in case
if please God she should be delivered with a Son, it is my Will
and Desire, and I do Give and Bequeath to said Son the Houses
and Land where Capt Thomas Calvert now lives on, and Likewise
that part of Lot of Land which I have agreed for with Joseph Calvert
which was Bought of Col^d Anthony Walker to him and his Heirs forever

And

And if in leave it should not be a Boy, I Give the said houses and
Land where Thomas Calvert now Lives in, and that Purchase
of Land with Joseph Calvert of Colly Anthony Walker, to my Son
James Willoughby and his Heirs forever.

Item I Give and Devise the Residue of my Estate, after paying my
Just Debts to be Divided and equally Divided amongst my
Children, and that the Remainder part of my Slaves after my
wife has taken her choice as before mentioned I Leave to be either
kept and Equally Divided or Sold at the Discretion of my Executors
for the Benefit of my Estate, and the Money arising to be divided
amongst my Children. Including the Child that my wife is
now big with.

And it is likewise my Will and Desire, that after my Wifes
Death, that the ten Negroes & their Increase given her During
her Life, should be Equally Divided amongst the Whole of my

her Life should be Equally Divided amongst the Whole of my
Children as before mentioned.

And Last I Nominate my Brother John Willoughby, Capt^l
Paul Loyall, M^r James Taylor and M^r John Taylor, or as
many of them as will Act to be my Executors of this my last
Will and Testament In Witnefs whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and Affixed my Seal the Day and Year first before
Writing.
