I give and bequeath unto my son David Carson one negro fellow called Jim, one negro child called Moll and one Wench called Sarah one mare, called Hope, one hand mill, one grindstone, one gun, and cyder barks, and all my cyper utensils one cedar desk, one mahogany table, one ox cart one yoke steers and all the plantation tools I give unto him my said son David Carson if he comes in person to receive the same. Item I give and bequeath unto my said son David Carson ten pounds in silver current money of Virginia likewise two ewes and two cows and calves if he comes in person to receive the same. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail Murray wife of John Murray one horse called Rowley one small looking glass one walnut desk, one negro girl called Phillis ~~and one called Betty to her~~ my said daughter Abigail Murray and her heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Wilson one negro girl called Rachel and one negro Boy called Jack, likewise one horse called Luby one mahogany table and one large looking glass to her and her heirs. Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson David Murray one negro Boy called Charles to him and his heirs.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Christopher Wilson one negro Boy called George but my will and desire is that the said negro boy George be left in the possession of my daughter Margaret Wilson for her to have the use of him the said negro Boy George until my grandson Christopher Wilson arrive to the age of sixteen years and if my said grandson ^{Christopher Wilson} should die before he arrive to the age of twenty one years then I give and bequeath the said negro boy George unto my granddaughter Frances Wilson & her heirs.

for and require that my grandson Christopher Wilson one negro boy called George but my will and
desire is that the said negro boy George be left in the possession of my daughter Margaret Wilson for her
to have the use of him the said negro boy George until my grandson Christopher Wilson arrive to the
age of sixteen years and if my said grandson ^{Christopher Wilson} should die before he arrive to the age of twenty one years
then I give and bequeath the said negro boy George unto my granddaughter Frances Wilson & her heirs. —
Item All my stock and provisions at my decease that I have not bequeathed I give and bequeath unto
my daughters Abigail Murray and Margaret Wilson to be equally divided between them likewise all
the cash remaining at my decease and not already mentioned after my kitchen and corn out is finish-
ed I give it to them and their heirs. — Item all the Rest " " residue and remainder of my estate of what
nature or kind soever after my legacies lawful debts and funeral expences are paid I leave to be
equally divided between my son David Cannon if he comes in person — and my two daughters
Abigail Murray and Margaret Wilson. Item My will and desire is that if my son David Cannon does
not come in person to receive the legacies already mentioned my desire is " " " They remain in the
possession of my two daughters Abigail Murray and Margaret Wilson and their heirs. — Lastly —
I nominate and appoint my son in law John Murray and ^{my daughter} Margaret Wilson executor & executrix of
this my last will and testament. I ~~therefore~~ ^{whereof} ~~thereunto~~ ^{unto} set my hand and seal this ninth
day of October in the year of our lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine. —

said son James and his heirs forever. -

Item I give and bequeath to my loving daughter Elizabeth Godfrey the following slaves to wit Olive, Jenny,
and Hannah also one cow and calf to her my said daughter Elizabeth and her heirs forever. -

Item I give and bequeath to my son in law William Marley during his natural life the use of my slaves,
Jone, Mariat, and Ned, and after his decease I give the said slaves and the Increase to be equally divided
between my three grandchildren Elizabeth Marley, John Marley, and Ann Marley and their heirs
forever. -
