of Twenty One Years or Without Lawful Issue then I Give
the said Land to my Daughter Sarah Brindle her Heirs or
Assigns And if it should Happen that my said Daughter
Sarah Die before Marriage, or before she arrives to the Age
of Twenty One Years then I Give the said Land to Anne
Ballance her Heirs or Assigns

I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Ballance
a Good Bed and Furniture I desire likewise that my Wives

a Good Bed and Furniture I desire Likewise that my Wear-
ing Apparel may be Equally Divided between my two Daugh-
ters and Likewise that Anne may have the Wool & Flax
to Gloath her and the Children

I Desire all the Rest that belongs to me may be sold &
the Money arising therefrom be Applied Towards discharg-
ing my Just Debts And What remains to be Equally
Divided among my three Children And if either my Son, or
Daughter Sarah should die before they come to the Age of
Twenty One and the Part so Given to be Equally Divided
between the Other two. And Lastly I do Appoint my
Brother Daniel Macfaddon to be Executor of this my Last
Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Affixed my Seal this Nineteenth day of

September 1755 —
