First my will is that my funerals Charges
& last debts be satisfied and paid as soon as
may be after my Decease
Item. I give and bequeath to my faithfull nurse
Sanny Shelton, all my Outstanding debts
2^d After my last debts are satisfied & paid
what remains to be divided the one
half to be given to the poor of the Town
for their Support &c. The other half to
be equally divided between William
Whipple & Bernard Manning which

 day of November in the Year of Our Lord one
 Thousand Seven Hundred & Ninety Two.
