In the Name of God. Amen April the 1st 1760 I Matthew
bonally of the Borough of Norfolk, being very sick and weak in
Body, but of perfect Mind and Memory, Thanks be given to
God, Therefore calling unto Mind the Mortality of my Body, &
and knowing it is once for men appointed to die do make
and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say,
First I give and recommend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God
that gave, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting, but at the general Resurrection I shall receive

the same again by the Power of God, and as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I do
give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner,
and form.

Imp^o I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Bridget and Rosanna
bonally all my worldly substance real and personal to be equally
divided amongst them forever, after my Debts are paid, and like-
wise do appoint and constitute the Rev^d Charles Smith now
Minister of this Parish to be my Executor, and I do invest him with
the whole of my Estate till the above Daughters are of Age, or
otherwise provided in Marriage, As Witnes my hand and Seal
the day and Year above written
