In the name of god amen. I Moses Richardson bring of perfect forces and memory: Pled to god for it. I thought fit
to make this my last will and testament in manner and forme as followeth. In witness whereof I gave and bequeath my soul
to god my maker and to his only son Jesus Christ and to remain hoping through the merits of his precious blood
to live with him for ever. For it is such unto is mercy whereof I hope to be Rejoice among the happy
Company of the Saints and angels and there to remain in unity peace and friendship for ever and my body to be buried
in a Christian and decent manner according to the Direction and order of my Executors hereafter named.

Now I gave and bequeath to my son William Richardson the plantation that I knowe live one and all the Land
belonging to it being one hundred thirty three acres more or less to him and is heard
I gave in to my son John Richardson the plantation that I bought of Thomas Tucker and all the Land
belonging to it being eighty acres to him and is heard and one hundred acres of Swamp Land lying
and being one brooks Run to him and is heard and if my son John Dies without heirs then
the said Land to go to my son Moses Richardson and is heard and if my son Moses Dies without heirs
then to go to my son Jeremiah Richardson and is heard.

Now I gave and bequeath to my son Moses Richardson twenty five acres of Land on the side of the western
joining to the Land that was formerly Thomas Tuckers and going to the Land that was Samuel Bunker
is heard and to my son Moses Richardson one garden

Now I gave to my son Jeremiah Richardson the Corn that I now live and are all belonging to it at this time
my Blanket and Shirts and bawler and my one riding gown and one large pulber Ditch of some paint
and all the tools of my Estate that it hath pleased god to bless me with in this life. I desire that
it may be equall divided between among all my Children as Cabot Hoag and all other houses house
goods and all for my Sons I gave to my son John Richardson my son Jeremiah Richardson to look after

As I live before the Court to this age of one and twenty
and I make my self John Pickson my hole and sole Executor of this my Last will
and Testament In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this
2 Day of January 1752
