boder but thanked be unto god of pfect memory doe make my last will & Testament ad
followeth this second day of September in y^e year of o. and One Thousand Six hundred
fifty & two first I bequeath my soule to God my heavenly maker, & my body to y^e Earth
& my worldly Estate as followeth I give & bequeath Six Cowes, one two years
unto heifer, & two exchange all female to be divided equally betweene my wife Jane
Higlesworth & my two Children, Mary & Dorothy In y^e then female surcease to be
divided when my daughter Mary cometh to Eighteen years of age or at her day of
marriage, but my daughter Dorothys part to remaine in y^e possession of my wife

untill she cometh to y^e age of Sixteen on the day of her marriage. But if either of
y^e children dye before they come to y^e age, then that then is to possess that part, but if
they should both dye, Then my wife is to possess them as her owne proper goods. And
likewise I give unto my two children to be paid them at their dayes of marriage the
some of five hundred pounds of tobacco & more. I likewise give unto my wife y^e land
that I now have upon Durango her life, then to Equally divided betweene my two
daughters. Likewise give unto John Heyman, the some of John Heyman's & some
value to be delivered him about two yeres hence at y^e age of some weeks, if it be
some of yere & thereto food, y^e value to be one of y^e stocks beforementioned. The wife
appoint my wife to give my servant John Dutto a home value for his
charge, to make it & deliver it, to his use about three yeres hence, but y^e value to
remaine in y^e custody of my wife untill y^e John Dutto be free. for what other estate
is mine y^e I am possess^r of. I give unto my wife to performe this my will & to pay
these debts y^e I owe, And y^e I give unto my servant Charles Mognan, if he serve
out his time wth out trouble, my best suite of cloathes, besides his freedom
cloathes. I appoint Charles Mognan, Tobbe Mowere, & Tobbe Capps to be
witnesses to see y^e this my will performed. I desire likewise y^e my hono^r Exeute
or assigned doe give unto Tobbe Capps & Tobbe Springe, as part and assurance
of y^e land that I sold them, as if I my selfe were alive to doe it. To this my
