Lying and being in the County of Norfolk) to be sold by my Executors  
herein after named or the Survivor or Survivors of them who shall take  
the burden of the Execution hereof on them for ready money or such  
Credit as they shall Judge) but for the Advantage of my Estate And that  
for the Payment of my Just and Lawfull Debts in the first place) And the  
Overplus of the money to be raised by the Sale of aforesaid after my Debts  
are paid I Give and bequeath the same to my Son Joh: Merry when  
he Arrives at the Age of Twenty One Years or Marriage) and to his heirs

and I Give and bequeath the same to my Son John Merry when  
he Arrives at the Age of Twenty one Years or Marriage and to his heirs.  
But in Case my said Son should happen to die before he comes of Age  
or is Married Then it is my Will and I Give Twenty five Pounds thereof  
to the Eldest Child of my Sister Elizabeth that shall be then living and  
Twenty five Pounds more thereof to the Eldest Child of my Sister Mary  
that shall be then living and the Residue thereof to my Brother Thomas  
Merry and to their heirs. But the Interest or Use of the said Money

to Die before he comes of Age or is Married Then I Give and bequeath the  
same to my Brother Thomas Merry & his heirs But that the Interest shall
