large silver spoons my riding chair one cow and all the money that I give her and
now in her possession. —

them and their heirs forever and all the rest and residue of my estate after my just
debts and funeral expenses are paid, I give to be equally divided between my two
daughters Abigail and Prudence Thelaball to them and their Heirs forever. —

And lastly I do hereby revoke all former wills by me heretofore made, and appoint my
loving daughters Abigail and Prudence Thelaball and my loving son Frederick Bouch
and Matthew Godfrey executors of this my last will and testament In witness where
of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirty first day of January
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight.
