houses of Capt. Edward Cogh being two hundred and sixty
three feet and an half on the Street, to him my said
son and his Heirs for ever.

I give and Devise to be sold by my Executors hereafter
named, my three Negro Men, to wit, Sharper, Linnick, and
other; and the Money arising by such Sale to my said
son William.

I give and bequeath
my Wife Alice Jewelling my
and Heirs for ever.
above Devise of the House and
my Wife Alice during her natural Life in lieu of
my Dowry, she not making any Waste nor cutting any
timber or Trees save for the necessary use of the Planta-
tion. I also give to my said Wife the Bed and Furni-
ture, one Seal-Skin Trunk, one Desk, one Chest painted
green Tables, all my sitting chairs, one Tea Kettle, two Potts
a pair of And-Irons, all my Pewter, one Horse and one
cow and Yearling, one Barrel and Cails, two fowl
Barrels of Corn, and sufficient Fodder for the same.

son William.

I give and bequeath
Negro Woman Sarah

my Wife Alice during her natural life in Town of
Dover, she not making any Waste nor cutting any
timber or Trees save for the necessary use of the Planta-
tion. I also give to my said Wife the Bed and Furniture
on which I usually lie, one Desk, one Chest painted
blue, one Seal-Skin Trunk, one Walnut Tea Table, two
Dining Tables, all my sitting Chairs, one Tea Kettle, two Pots
one pair of And-Irons, all my Belster, one Horse and one
cow and Yearling, and all my Tubbs and Bails, two good Har-
row Barrells of Corn, and sufficient Fodder for the said cow
Yearling and Horse, one Sow and Piggs, Eight Shoats.

I give and bequeath to my Wife's Grand-Daughter Mary
Holmes, Daughter of John Holmes fifteen pounds current
Money to be laid out in Schooling and bringing up the
said Mary.

I give and bequeath all the Rest and remainder of my
Estate of whatsoe to be sold by my Executors and the
Money arising by such Sale (after all my just Debts
are paid) I give the same to my son William, to whom

I also give off the rest of residue of my Personal Estate: —

I make and Ordain my Brother John Sewelling and my good Friend John Whipple Esq. Gentlemen Executors of this my last Will and Testaments. —

And I do hereby declare that my intent and meaning is, that if my said Son William should depart this Life before he attains to lawfull Age, without Issue in that Case I give and bequeath all the Estate before given to my said Son William to be equally divided into four parts, one fourth part of which I give to my Brother Abel Sewelling, and his Heirs, one other fourth part to my Brother John Sewelling and his Heirs. One other fourth part to my Brother Paul Sewelling and his Heirs; And the other fourth part to be equally divided between my two Cousins Richard Ingham, and Elizabeth Ingham and their Heirs. —

And I do hereby revoke all former Wills by me heretofore made. In ¹¹⁵ witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 1st Day of September Anno Domini 1760 and Sixty One.
