Devise the said Land and Plantation, unto the eldest son of my
said son Willis and his Heirs for ever, and in case he should have
no son I then give and devise the said land and plantation
unto the eldest Daughter of my said son Willis and his Heirs for
Ever, and in case my said son Willis should have neither son nor daughter

I then give and devise the said land and plantation unto
Richard, and his Heirs for ever —

Item I give and devise unto my son John One Hundred Acres of Land

Item I give and devise unto my son John One Hundred Acres of Land which I purchased from Anthony, and William Bartee, and after the Decease of my said son John, I give and Devise the said Land unto The Eldest son of the said John, and his Heirs for ever, And in default of such son, I then give and Devise the said Land unto the Eldest Daughter of my said son John, and his Heirs for ever, and in case my said son John, should have neither son, nor Daughter, I then give the said Land unto my son Richard and his Heirs for ever. ~

Item I give and devise unto my sons Willis and John, and their Heirs for ever Fifty Acres of Swamp Land to be equally divided between them ~

Item I give unto my son Richard. Negroes Jack and Jupiter never theless my said son Richard is not To take possession of them until the Year 1779. and they are to stay on the plantation till then. ~

Item. I Leave to my loving wife, during her widowhood, the use of Negroes St. 50 & Boatswain &c. & Jupiter for the time.

They are to stay on the plantation, near the life on condition that
my said wife let negro. Bookwain be hired out one year / the first /
for the benefit of my estate ~ and also leave to my said Loving wife
during her widowhood the use of Negroes Hannah, and Hagar, and
little Hannah as also two of my best Beds and furniture, Two of my
best cows, one yoke of Oxen, one house named Hazzard, one hand
mill and all my Household furniture not otherwise given away
By this my Will ~

I Item I give unto my Daughter, Francis, Boussille, one negro Boy
named Robert, one small still, also the sum of Twenty five Pounds ^(money) current

I Item I give unto my Daughter Dinah Manning, one negro Girl
called Abai, now in the possession of her husband, also the sum of Twenty
five pounds current money

I Item I give unto my Daughter Betty Whitehouse one negro Girl
named Cecilia, now in her possession, also the sum of

Twenty five Pounds current money

I Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Anne and sister

named Leah, now in her possession, also the sum of
Twenty five Pounds current money

Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Anne one negro Girl named
Hannah / my Loving wife to have the use of her during her Widowhood,
I also give unto my said Daughter one Feather Bed and furniture,
One cow and calf also the sum of Twenty five Pounds current money

Item I give unto my Daughter Rebecca, one negro Girl named
Kate, one Feather Bed and furniture, one cow and calf, also the sum
of Twenty five Pounds current money

Item I give unto my sons Willis and John Two guns, my son Willis
to have the first choice

Item I leave negro's Forington, Jonas, and Nan, to my Executors
hereafter named, to be hired out yearly, during the widowhood of
my wife, or until the amount of their Hire shall be sufficient to pay the Cash
Legacies by me ~~thence~~ left and given. And I ^{do} give the said

Negroes to be Equally Divided amongst all my children, But in case
Said wife should die or marry before there is money in the Executors
Hands sufficient for the Purpose aforesaid that Then they sell any of the said
Negroes to make up the Deficiency, and the remainder of the said
Negroes to be Equally divided amongst all my children as aforesaid
Item, I Leave to my loving Wife during her Widowhood the use of Negro
Boy Little Farrington —

Item, all the negroes, together with the stock and Househould furni-
ture, hereby Left my loving Wife during her Widowhood, at the ex-^{piration}
of that Term, I give to be equally divided amongst all my children.

Item, all the remainder of my Estate not given by this my Will I leave
To be sold, and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided
Amongst all my children

Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving Wife Executrix and my
son in ^{law} ~~law~~, William Boushells, Executor to this my Last Will and
Testament, and that the said William Boushells be allowed at the rate

of four shillings current money per Day, for every Day he shall be emp-
