if my Wife can give security for my Debts and the Legacies left

accepted in that Case the whole of my Estate Real and Personal

except the Land hereafter mentioned in the old Will I hereby
Will and Bequeath to her she paying or giving Bond if my Sons
Stephen and William are not of age at the Time of my Decease the
full sum of One hundred Pounds Current Money of Virginia to
each of them to Continue the Universal Magazine untill my
Son Stephen of Age which I then give and bequeath to him as
also my Silver Salts and Shovel; and my Steel Seal Chamber
Dictionary & Supplement I give and Bequeath to my son
William — I likewise give and Bequeath unto my son

Stephen a small piece of Land purchased of Mess^{rs} Joseph
 Hutchings and John Smith as it now is in two Triangles joining
 together (or as it will be should I as I propose agree with the above
 named Gentleman make it a square lot) containing one
 acre and half of Land be it more or less. And to my son
 William I give and bequeath that Lot of Land purchased of
 the said Gentleman and called Lot thirty nine and bounded
 to the Westward by Cumberland Street and to the Southward by
 Queen Street And I do hereby my said Wife Mary Scott sole
 Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby
 Revoking all former Wills Decors of Gift or Dea by me at any
 time heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my Hand & Seal this Twenty Eighth Day of June & in
 the Year of our Lord 1764.
