

In the Name of God. Amen. I Richard Wallace of the Borough of  
Norfolk Ship-Master, being Sick and Weak in Body but of Sound Mind and  
Memory, Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner  
and form following, that is to say, First, I give and bequeath to my  
Honoured Father Thomas Wallace, and to my Honoured Mother Elizabeth  
Wallace his Wife of holy Island in the County Palatine of Durham in  
Great Britain the Sum of Eight pounds Sterling per Annum during  
their joint lives; and in case of the Death of either of them, I give the  
same to the Survivor of them, during the Life of such Survivor, And do  
Subject my Real as well as Personal Estate to the payment thereof; and  
desire my Executors hereafter named to make annual payment thereof.  
Item. It is my Will and desire that on the Decease of my said Father and Mother  
(when the payment of the Legacy or Annuity above Devised to them is to  
cease), then my Executors hereafter named shall pay, to my two Sisters  
Mary and Thomasine, or the survivor of them, One hundred pounds Sterling.  
And if both my said Sisters shall die in the Lifetime of my said Father &  
Mother or the Survivor of them, then the Legacy above devised to my said  
Sisters shall

Sisters is to become lapsed and the payment thereof to cease.

And all the Rest and Residues of my Estate Real and Personal I Give and Bequeath to my loving Wife Ann Wallace, to her and her Heirs for ever.

And I do hereby make my said Wife whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. And do hereby revoke all former Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this twenty first Day of July in the Year One thousand Seven hundred and sixty four.
