

In the Name of God Amen, I Robert King of the county of Norfolk in the Colony of Virginia being, —
weak in Body but of disposing mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God therefore for a quietness in my
family do make ~~and~~ this my last will and testament in the following manner viz. —

I give unto my wife Mulley all my whole estate that I own during her life or marriage. after her death or
marriage I give and bequeath to my son George thirty acres of my Land the place that I bought first together
with five wood and fencing of from the Land ^{that} I bought last to him and his heirs forever, and if he should die —
without heir the said Land to fall to my son Miles and his heirs forever, and if he should die without heirs
the said Land to fall to my son Edmund and his heirs forever. —

I give to my daughter Mulley my trinal Bed and furniture and after my wife's death or marriage all my
movable estate to be sold and I give to my children, Margaret, Miles, Mulley and George five pounds each
and the remainder to be divided amongst all my children in witness whereof to this my last will and testa-
ment I have set my hand and seal this second day of October 1775, in the presence of us —
