thanks be to Almighty God. Do make and Ordain this my last Will
and Testament, in Manner & form following.

Imprimis I Give and Bequeath unto my son Caleb McCoy, the plantation
on which I now live, being One hundred Acres more or less, to him
and his Heirs and assigns for ever. I likewise give him and his Heirs
my Gun, Bayonet and Cartouch Box.

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary McCoy, One Heifer
and her Increase to her and Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughters Martha McCoy and Elizabeth
and Everdamb to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Sarah McCoy
the Use of my above mentioned Plantation untill my son Caleb
arrives to the age of Twenty one, but if my dear Wife should die
before Caleb arrives to the age of twenty One, Then my Will and
devise is that Samuel Chappin my Neighbour, should take the
Plantation into his care and do as he thinks fit, so as not to
prejudice it but to make the most for my son Caleb that he
conveniently can. As I have bound my son to him —

All the Rest and Residue of my Estate that is not already
given I Give and Bequeath unto my Dear and Loving Wife
Sarah McCoy, She paying all my Just Debts —

And Lastly I constitute, appoint and Ordain, Her to be my
whole and sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament
In Witness whereof I have Hereunto set my Hand and Seal
