That on Tuesday the Twenty second of this Instant they were at The
House of M^{rs} Sarah Livingston who was then very sick but in her
perfect sense when the said Sarah Livingston called for her Niece
Miss Peggy Wheeler daughter of John Cheshire and told her that she
gave her her Negro Girl Sarah and desired these Defendants to take

Notice thereof and that the said Sarah Livingston departed this
Life on or about eight O'clock of this 2^d day of February 1763
Further said not.
