Item I give & bequeath unto my Uncle Sol^o Smith the
Woe of my Negro Boy Jack tel his son John Smith comes
to age of Twenty one years then I give the said Negro boy
Jack to him the said John Smith & his heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath all the money I have by me to be
Equally to be divided between my Uncle Sol^o Smith
& my Sister Sarah Miller. I do nominate & appoint my
Uncle Sol^o Smith to be my executor

& my Sister Sarah Miller. I do nominate & appoint my

said Sarah Smith do make this my last will & Testament
