of Portsmouth Parish in Norfolk County being sick and weak
in Body but in my perfect sense and sound Memory Thanks
be to the Almighty God for the same I do make and Ordain
this to be my last Will and Testament in manner & form as fol-
loweth First I commend my Soul unto the Almighty God
that gave it me and my Body to the Earth to be buried in
a Christian like and decent manner at the Discretion of my
Executors And touching such Worldly Goods as it hath pleased

The Almighty God to bless me with I do give and devise
in the manner and form as followeth hereby revoking
making void all other Wills & Testaments by me heretofore
made.

1^{stly} I give & bequeath unto my Son Thomas Creech my Land that was
his grandfathers and half my Water Mill to him & his Heirs
forever after the expiration of my Wives Widowhood I also give
unto my said Son Thomas Creech my Negro Boy called Caesar
& I give & bequeath unto my Son Stephen Creech my Land that
I purchased of Demage Hatton and the other half of my Wa-
ter Mill to him and to his Heirs forever after the expira-
tion of my Wives widowhood I also give unto my said
Son Stephen Creech my Negro Boy called Paps.

3^{dly} I give & bequeath unto my Son Solomon Creech my Land
which I purchased of George Granbery to him & to his
Heirs forever after the expiration of my Wives Widowhood
I also give unto my said Son Solomon Creech my Negro
Boy called Pomp & my Still.

4^{thly} I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Creech my Negro
Boy called Pomp & my Still.

4^{thly} I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Creech my Negro Girl called Kate and one Feather Bed and Furniture

5^{thly} I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elisabeth Creech my Negro Girl called Nester and one Feather Bed & Furniture

6^{thly} I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Judith Creech my Negro Girl called Charity and one Feather Bed & Furniture

7^{thly} It is my Will and desire that if either of my Two Sons Thomas Creech or Stephen Creech should die without Issue that the surviving Brother should have his Land and half of the Mill It is also my ~~same~~ Will that if either ^{one} of my Negroes die that I have given unto my children before they come of Age to receive them that they shall have another made up to them out of my Estate of the like value And if either one of my children shall die under age that their Legacies should be divided among the rest of my children.

8^{thly} It is my Will that each of my children shall receive their Legacies as they arrive to Lawfull age It is also my Will that after my outstanding Debts are collected and my Just Debts
