to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Sam^r Willoughby Eight
Negroes Ishmael, Mark, Isaac, Rosale, Kate, & Younger & three
Youngest Children to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Willoughby

Manner and I disposed of my money as follows

That is to say

Item I Give and bequeath to my Eldest Son John Willoughby Seven Negroes Sam, Gold, Pleasant, Lewis and Harriet three youngest Children and my Manor Plantation with the Land belonging to it to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Sam^r Willoughby Eight Negroes Ishmael, Mark, Kate, Rosale, Kate, & Younger & three youngest Children to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Willoughby Seven Negroes Daniel, Peter, Lussa, Page & my three other Children to him and his Heirs forever I also Give and bequeath One Lot of Land in Norfolk Town in Cumberland Street One Bed and Furniture to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Will^m Willoughby Six Negroes Sam, James, John, Hagar and two Children to him & his Heirs forever I also Give & bequeath my Plantation in

The land belonging to it up the Head of Masons Creek and one
Bed & Furniture to him and his heirs forever
Then I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Willoughby
and Lot of Land in West^h Town in Cumberland Street
Joining to a Lot that I have to my Son Thomas Willoughby he
taking his choice to have and her heirs forever I also Give & Bequeath
to my Daughter Susan Rogers George, Ned, Frank and Nancy &
three Children, Mary, Isaac, Isaac to her and her heirs forever
and one Bed and Furniture
Then I Give & Bequeath my best Bed and Furniture to my
Wellbeloved Wife Ann Willoughby and One Hundred Acres of Land
Lying in the North West Woods that Abraham Beasley now lives
On to Sell, and make Use of the Money, as she thinks fit, Also
notwithstanding what is before Mentioned me, Wife and David
and I do Will & Bequeath to my said Wife Ann Willoughby
during her Natural life the Labour and Service of Two Negroes
of my Above Mentioned Negroes viz^t Sam, Ishmael, Daniel Tom
as I to the said Mary, Hagar, Nancy, Tobiah, & after her

I, John Willoughby, do hereby certify that the said Mary, Haged, Hannah, Tobey, & Peter
Decedent to my children as before mentioned my Will & Desire is
that my three Eldest Sons shall take all the Rest that is given
in their Possession after my Decedent except them that I have
to my Wellbeloved Wife during her Natural Life

Item I Give and bequeath all the Rest Residue & Remainder
of my Estate of Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Hogs & Household Goods & Plate
Money and the like of what Nature Quality or Condition soever
it be to my Wellbeloved Wife Ann Willoughby during her Natural
Life and after her Decedent to be Equally Divided among all my
Children share & share alike, and my Will and Desire is, ^{that} when my
two Youngest Children come of Age after my Decedent to receive
their Portions that is given except them that is mentioned to my
Wife during her Natural Life I nominate & appoint my Loving
Wife Ann Willoughby, my Son John Willoughby, my Wife & Son
Esq.^{rs} of this my Last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have set
my hand & seal this 5th day of September 1752 Thomas Willoughby Seal
