

In the name of Good Omens I amary the 10<sup>th</sup> 1654. I Chornabright  
of the M. ffeine branch of Elizabeth Linn in the County of East Che  
in Virginia planter, being sicke & weak of body but perfect in minde &  
memorye. prayed by the Lord for it. Ie make this my last will and  
testament first givinge biquath my soule to God, my body to the  
grave, & my mire & goods at followeth. I give & bequeath unto my  
nebblesome Thomas Bright, my plantation with landes so not  
spint. provided he will come & live upon it so soone as he cometh into  
Virginia, and if he will not or if he doth not live to: move it there  
I give & bequeath it to my nebblesome James Bright & his  
yngre unto my nebblesome Thomas Bright A tract of Land  
being two hundred acres lyng or bounding on Ol' Creek & another  
lande, & the said lande being my sonne Thomas a bove: a childe  
hauing much & cleared ground ad two hundred landes ad so more  
the same when he is fiftie yeare of age, and when he die of naturall  
yeare of age to enioy all the plantation is all that I will be longe  
to him by thid my last will & testam. Provided that if he die before  
from thence after in thid spint bequeathed, or dyed before this my  
will performed I will see him capable of the same, and if not then  
to carry till he is twenty one yeare of age. And if he die before  
the said time named one fother bed & bolster, or otherwise of

present provided he will come & live upon it for some time & if he doth not  
die within the space of three years in Virginia, and if he will not or if he doth not live to make it his  
I give & bequeath it to my good Lassd sonne James Wright & to his  
widow unto my wellbeloved sonne William Wright A tract of Land  
being two hundred acres lying or bounded on the ~~Ridge~~<sup>Ridge</sup> & ~~the~~<sup>the</sup> ~~W.~~<sup>W.</sup>  
flane ~~Ridge~~<sup>Ridge</sup>, about Ileas, my sonne Thomas a boordman & get  
having muche & leareid ground aboue handspan land, also to have  
the same when he is fiftie yeeres of age, and nothinge before  
yeares of age to move vall the plantation is all that I will oblong  
to him so that my last will & testamant provided that y. m. belives  
of him herafter in thre yearees perifid & ordyned to l. This m  
will pformed I yet see him capable of the same, and if not then  
to carry till he is twenty one yeares of age. And I do a like queaste  
my sonne the above named one fetherbed, bolster, one pair of  
blanketts, one pair of flitts, one chist being of Joynes wood, one  
table, one furene, one shaper, one couch, one iron potte and a stell,  
one Pitt. And I give unto my said sonne James Wright one  
potte, and to my said sonne William Wright one iron potte  
And I give unto my sonne the lassd sonne Richard Wright one iron potte  
And I give & bequeath unto my wellbeloued daughter Jane Wright

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one feather bed at all times, belonging to her wife, also one bolster and pair  
of blankets, one rugge and full quilted p' pallante, and one small  
cabinet, one gold ringe her mother gave her on her death bed,  
And I give unto my well beloved daughter Christian Wright, one  
looking glass and gold ringe her mother gave her, and I give  
unto my two daughters above named two gowndes two petticoates  
of thine mother deceased. I desire they may be sold for the  
use & benefit. And I give unto my sonne Richard Wright one  
hundre drams upp, and I desire it for you to bequeath unto my  
three children above named all the rest of my whole estate equally  
to be divided betwix them, and I desire my childe & children should  
have three years schoolding, and to live upon my plantation all  
the while provided that if the Exports <sup>de</sup> concerned of this my w<sup>m</sup>  
I gaue fit convenient. And I doe desire that my goats  
and swine hoggs and all my Steeds & old meale Cattle & gold  
be sold at the best advantage to paye for my Childrens schoolding  
and what else shall be necessary for them. And I doe give unto  
my sonne James Wright two hds of tobaccoe, and to my sonne  
Richard Wright one hds of tobaccoe w<sup>m</sup> falle made of the said  
goats hoggs & māle cattle. And I desire by this present instrument  
ordaine my well beloved friend Mr Edmund Mason M<sup>r</sup> of Barnard  
Conquest M<sup>r</sup> William Watson & Richard Starnell of the bōnd said  
County to be my Exports & chūchours of this my last will and

and it fulfilled in due proportion to theire power & fitt estate.  
And in case towards them I give unto each of them two hundred  
pounds of tobaccoe & seede And I give to be quenched unto them aye  
my servant at present one Cowe (alſo to be deliuered by the first of  
March) excepting the deere herof. In witness whereof I have  
unto these presents ſet my hande Sealed the day and year & in the  
aboue written.

Made to be recorded the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Feby: 1654:

If the aboue ſaid to beake doo I doo ſtate that wherab my ſonne Thomas Wright  
in this bound ſayes purtance is by my will to haue two hids of tobo-  
accoe & haueing conſidered wth my ſelfe I doo ſtate that if my  
ſonner Thomas Wright daeth þis þe þe will ſet his ſea þat he  
may haue þis ſaid two hids of tobaccoe, þo enioy the ſame at the  
diftreacion of my beloued friend aboue named to ſee my will performed  
þo, witness whereof I hereunto ſet my hande the day & year a bove  
written.
