

In the Name of God, Amen, I ~~Wills~~ Williams of the County of Norfolk
in the Colony of Virginia being very sick in body but of perfect mind & memory
do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner following. First I
recommend my soul to God who gave it me in hopes of a joyful resurrection
at the Day of Judgment and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried at
the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and unto my Worldly Goods
I dispose of as followeth.

First of all, I Give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Joyce Williams all
my moveable Estate and Household Goods during her life time and after her Death
to be divided equally among my Children to them and theirs heirs for ever.
I Give and Bequeath unto my Son John Williams all my Land where I now
Live and to my wife Joyce Williams during her widowhood to him and
his Heirs for ever, and my Grey Horse to sold to pay my Debts and my two Petty
Augers. Also I Give and Bequeath unto my two Sons Robert and Joseph
Williams ^{the} my Negro Wench to be Equally divided among them her
and her Increase for ever to them and their Heirs for ever.

I Give unto Cousin John Williams to him and his Heirs for ever my old Canoe.

I do appoint my friend Mr John Joy and Mr Arthur Boush sole Executors
of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my Hand and Seal this first Day of July 1765
