to be my last Will and Testament in manner & Form following First
I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me
and my Body to the earth whither it was taken to be buried by my Ex^{or}
after named and as for what temporal Estate it hath pleased Almighty
God to bestow on me I give as followeth Viz: —

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Barrington and him now in
his own Profession also and his heirs called Squire in full of his part
of my Estate except such other part of my Estate as I shall further give
him.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Sam^l Barrington Twenty Nine Acres
of Land that I took up and patented up County Road to him and his
heirs for ever also and now in his possession.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Sam^l Barrington all that Land &
Plantation now lived on which I purchased of Henry Sharplee to
him and his heirs forever only preserving that my loving Wife Sarah
have and enjoy the said Land and plantation and house thereto be-
longing during her natural life or Widowhood without Molestation
I also give unto my said son Sam^l my Land Mill and Grindstone & all

longing during her natural life or Widowhood without molestation
I also give unto my said son Lem: my hand mill and grindstone & all
the cattle and hogs belonging to the plantation or elsewhere that are
his proper share at the time of my Death also the great Bed & Furni-
ture up stairs, my saddle and Bridle, & all my working Tools of all
sorts whatever, one small Iron Pick, one Iron spit, one old fowls &
my own large gun and frying Pan &c

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Marg: Cherry Twenty shill:
to be paid her out of my Estate.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Judith Barrington my Bed
and furniture & commonly by on standing in the Hall also one
sorrel Horse called Spark and her saddle and Bridle that she was to
ride him with and all the Hogs on this Plantation & all my Wool &
Cotten and Flax and all my crop of Tob: & Corn and peas & all other
Grain to her and her Disposal for ever; And all my Leather of any
sort whatever I give to be equally divided between my said Wife & my
said son Lem:; I also give & bequeath unto my said loving Wife Judith
Barrington a full third of all my Estate of all kind & equality whatsoever
And as for the remainder of my Estate after my just Debts & funeral
Expences paid I give to be equally divided between my two sons W^m &
Sam^r Barrington & so of the

to be paid her out of my Estate.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Judith Barrington my Bed
and Furniture & commonly by on standing in the Hall also one
Sammel Horse called Spark and her Saddle and Bridle that she was to
ride him with and all the Hogs on this Plantation & all my Wool &
Gotten and Flax and all my Crop of Pot.^o & Corn and peas & all other
Grain to her and her Disposal for ever; And all my Leather of any
sort whatsoever I give to be equally divided between my said Wife & my
said Son Sam^l. I also give & bequeath unto my said loving Wife Judith
Barrington a full third of all my Estate of all kind & quality whatsoever.
And as for the remainder of my Estate after my just Debts & funeral
Expences paid I give to be equally divided between my two sons W^m &
Sam^l Barrington. I do appoint my loving Wife Judith & my son Sam^l
Barrington to be by & ⁱⁿ witness of this my last Will & Testament I do
