of her Portion, Item I give & bequeath to my loving wife Isabell breedle

all the hard & soft goods she has in her possession —
I have given and bequeath to my loving Brother Francis Cradock
the remainder part of my Estate within Doors and without, like
wills my Books and accounts making, ordaining, constituting
authorizing and confirming my said Brother Francis Cradock
my sole and sole Executor of this my last will & Testament, did
anulling and did allowing, revoking and renouncing all & every
former Will and Will Legacy or Legacies, bequeath or bequeaths
or anything of that Nature by me formerly made, given or be-
