Goldsby, and son John Goldsby, and the child that my
Wife now goes with, and that my wife Elizabeth Goldsby
shall have the use of the Childs money that she now goes
with untill it comes of age, if it lives, and if it should
Die for my Beloved wife Elizabeth Goldsby to have
one half of the Money and the other half to be Equely
Divided between my Daughter Jean Goldsby and
My son John Goldsby. &c.

Lastly I Appoint my Friend Maxamillion Collins Exec-
utor of this my last Will and Testament for Well

wood of Liverpool to him & his heirs forever.

Item I Give to my loving son Jonathan Calvert one half
of my money I have in the Loan office &

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Peggy
Calvert my house and land on the Corner of Church
Street which I purchased of Richard Wallace. but in case
my son Jonathan Calvert should chuse to pay her Eight
hundred pounds in Gold & Silver in lieu thereof in 11
