of Norfolk in Virginia, being of perfect Mind and Memory; hereby revoking
all former Wills, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, in
the manner and form following.

Imprimis, I command my Soul to Almighty God, who gave it, beseeching
Him of His most gracious goodness to accept it, according to His great mercy
and loving kindness, and my Body to the dust from whence it sprung, to
be decently interred according to the use and custom of said Borrough, together
with a funeral Sermon, the text to be taken from the 11th Chapter of the
Book of Job, and the 13th Verse, to be preached by the Rev'd Thomas Davis
a Minister of this Parish; whom I do hereby make, and appoint my lawful

the Executor to dispose of all my Effects, goods and movables, as hereafter
by me directed. (Viz.) I Bequeath all my wearing apparel consisting of
Bloaths, & Shirts, my Watch, and two pair of silver shoe-buckles, to be faithfully
remitted by the said Thomas Davis to Thomas Davison in Gateshead,
Joiner and Carpenter in the Bishoprick of Durham in England.

Item, I give and bequeath to the said Rev. & Thomas Davis all my Household
furniture, consisting of One beauroe bedstead and curtains, one field Bed with
Plaid cheque, six plain oak chairs with rush bottoms, one armed chair, with a
leathern bottom, one eight day clock, one large looking glass, and three small
D. One chest upon chest drawers in which are six china plates, eight stone-
plates, two tea pots, one diaper Table Cloath, one damask table cloath, five
round towels, four pair Sheets and one odd one, two pillows & one pillow case,
three blankets and one quilt, One close stool & pan, one large Tea-kettle, in
common, one new tea kettle about three quarts, one new sauce pan, two Iron
pots with covers, one copper coffee pot, One Tea-chest with six silver tea spoons,

potts with covers, one copper coffee pot, One Tea Chest with six silver tea spoons,
two Breakfast tables, one breakfast tea board, two brass candlesticks, two iron ^{sp},
One glass Lanthorn, One pocket Lanthorn, two Iron pokers, two pair of tongs.
One fire Shovel, one fender, Together with all my store goods — consisting of
twenty men's saddles, & two women's saddles, two large Rolls of blue Negroe
cotton, two Rolls of woolen and cotton stuff, a parcel of raisons, and a parcel
of pen knives, in short, every Article and particular, which I am now possessed
