with their Increase, also my bed & Bed & Furniture and the old Bed
at her Plantation, one Chest Drawers & the small Looking Glass that
is over the Chest of Dra half a Dozen of Silver Tea Spoons & Tongs
half a Dozen of silver & iron, Sixty Yards of Brown Shelling Linen
and half the other good is in my Chest where the brown Linen lies,
all the increase that is at the plantation and all the cattle that is at the
Plantation, & all that is in where I live except the three Draught Steers
before given to my sons also my young Spade Mare & my first Geld that
my young Mare Flower shall bring live to be fit to wear, also the little
Round Tea Table that was late here to her & her heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Godson, Sam^r Nashall, Thomas
Nash One Negro Boy named Jacob to him and his heirs forever
I give Seven hundred Pounds which is Due to me by Bonds to be equally
divided between my son Nathaniel Nash and my Daughter Elizabeth

my last Will & Testament. And I do utterly revoke & disannul all other former
