his hands that gave it me, and as for my body after my
Decease for to be decently buried by the Order and Direction
of my Executors

Item Firstly, after my Decease, I leave my Negro Man Lewis &
my Negro Woman Hannah, that is to say, the Use and
labour of them to my beloved wife Martha Peabworth her
natural lifetime and likewise my Mare called and
known by the Name of Madam

Item 2dly, After my decease I give to

Item 2dly. After my decease I give to my wife Martha Peabworth six Milch Cows and their calves and One pair of working Stears, and two feather Beds and furniture taking her choice of them. I give them to her and her heirs forever.

Item 3dly. After my decease I give to my Son William Peabworth and his heirs forever one pair of young Stears, and six head of cattle and one Bed and furniture and the Bedstead and my own Cloaths

Item 4thly. After my decease I give to my Son Mollen Peabworth and his heirs forever one Bed and furniture and Bedstead and my riding horse, Saddle and Bridle

Item 5thly. After my decease I give to my wife Martha Peabworth my hand Mill, two Iron Potts, and six Chairs and two Tables, two pewter Dishes and six plates one Linen Wheel and Woollen Wheel and Sae, and two Chests one large one

and one small one, and all my Sheep and all my Tea Ware with one
Sett of China to her and her heirs forever, After my decease I give
my wife Martha two thousand Piggs and nine large Hogans
Item 6thly, After my decease I leave all the Best of my moveable Estate
for to be sold, and the Money for to be equally divided amongst
my seven Children their Names as followeth, the Money that
my moveable Estate that is not walled away fetches is for to be
equally divided amongst Robert Pebworth, Paschents Jane Peb
worth, Mary Pebworth, Henry Pebworth, Susanna Pebworth,
James Pebworth, and Thomas Pebworth.

Item 7thly, After the decease of my wife Martha Pebworth I leave
my two Negroes Lewis and Hannah for to be appraised, and
my son William for to have my Negro Man Lewis and my son
Molten my Negro Wench Hannah paying to their four Brothers
and three Sisters their equal part of the said Value of the two
Negroes as if they had been sold and divided amongst them nine.
This is my last Will & Testament and I revoke, disannul and
make void all former Wills whatsoever. As Witnes my hand
and Seal this 20th day of January, 1760. I

for to have my Negro Man Lewis and my son
Molten my Negro Wench Hannah paying to their four Brothers
and three Sisters their equal part of the said Value of the two
Negroes as if they had been sold and divided amongst them nine.
This is my last Will & Testament and I revoke, disannul and
make void all former Wills whatsoever. As Witnes my hand
and Seal this 25th day of January 1760. I leave my wife Martha
my whole and sole Executrix
