During her Widowhood and the Bed and furniture that I now Lyes on for Ever
Item I Gave and Bequeeth to my Son Joseph Stafford one Negro Woman named Sary
to him and his heirs for Ever. and one hand Mill and a New suit of Clothes
Item I Gave and Bequeath to my Son James Stafford one Negro Boy named David
to him and his heirs Lawfully Begotten of his Body for Ever ^{if Not to return it to the heirs} one fether Bed
Item I Gave and Bequeath to my Son Samuel Stafford one Negro Garb named Bet
To him and his heirs Lawfully Begotten of his own Body if Not to return it to the heirs
Law and one fether Bed
Item I Gave and Bequeeth to my Daughter Lattorn one Negro Garb named Fred
to her and her heirs for Ever Lawfully Begotten if Not to return it to the heirs
Law and one fether Bed

Now I give and bequeath all the things that is Not Given the house hold Goods and
Cash and all the Movebels to be Divided into five Equil Parts all to Share a
Like With Paying all Just Debets and Dues and I Doe appoint my son Joseph
Stafford and my Wife Amey Stafford to be my Executors of This my Last will and
Testement This is my Will and shall Remain that my things should not be
Mislistd unto here here I Put my hand and seal
