In the Name of God Amen I William Stafford of the Western Branch of Norfolk County being very sick but in perfect Memory but considering the frailty and uncertainty of Mans Life and in order to ordain this to be my last Will and Testament revoking and annulling all former Wills by me made and this only to be my last Will and Testament that after my decease shall stand in manner and <sup>following</sup> form, to wit

Item I give and bequeath to my wife Amey Stafford one Negro fellow named Quoker during her Widowhood and the Bed and furniture that I now lies on forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Stafford one Negro Woman named Sary to him and his heirs forever and one hand Mill and a new suit of cloathes.

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Stafford one Negro Boy named David to him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body forever if not to return it to the heir at law one feather Bed.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Stafford one Negro Woman  
named Sary to him and his heirs forever and one hand Mill  
and a new suit of cloaths

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Stafford one Negro Boy  
named David to him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body  
forever if not to return it to the heir at Law one feather Bed

Item I give & bequeath to my son Saml Stafford one Negro Girl named Betty  
to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his own body if not to be  
turn it to the heir at Law and one leather Bed

I give and bequeath to my daughter Cather one Negro girl named Bridget to her and her heirs forever lawfully begotten if not to return it to the heir at Law and one feather Bed.

Item I give and bequeath all the things that is not given the household goods and Cash and all the Moveables to be divided into five equal parts all to share alike with paying all Just Debts and Dues. and I do appoint my son Joseph Stafford and my wife Amey Stafford to be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. This is my Will and shall remain that my things should not be mislisted unto here here I put my hand and seal.
